## **No Flood Protection for Hunton After All**

You may have seen items on BBC South East or ITV Meridian recently following an announcement by the Environment Agency (EA) that promised flood protection for Yalding and surrounding villages on the Beult and Teise (which includes Hunton of course) will not now be delivered. Instead the EA are saying they will recommend increasing protection for Tonbridge and Hildenborough by doing additional work on the Leigh barrier and also make some money available that individual householders elsewhere can apply for, in order to put in place their own flood protection and resilience. A maximum figure of £5,500 per household has been mentioned but we have been given no indication of the 'rules' defining who might be eligible to apply or what would be covered and what would not. Any additional spend would likely be at the householder's own expense. This seems in stark contrast to the commitments made, live on TV, by Messrs Cameron, Clegg and Carter during the 2013 floods.

Hunton is represented on the Medway, Beult and Teise (MBT) Flood Group, which is a group of concerned residents fighting for the sort of flood protection that we all deserve. This group has a number of concerns - not only about the decision, the way in which it has been reached and the lack of information forthcoming from those involved, but also about long term implications for us given the apparent focus on operation of the Leigh barrier to protect Tonbridge and Hildenborough only - especially as it is widely believed that this operation was a significant factor in the flooding seen in 2000 and again in 2013.

## **Changes to Bus Services**

There is a new timetable in operation for the buses serving Hunton. The No 26 bus has a few minor changes, most noticeably that the 14:07 bus from Maidstone to Hunton will now run 30 minutes earlier at 13:37. The school days only No 28 service is no longer operating. This has been replaced by the No 26A, which in the morning will now start from Pattenden Lane in Marden, continue through Chainhurst, reaching the bends at the bottom of East Street at around 7.30am and the stop outside the old post office on Hunton Hill at 7:36am. The afternoon 26A service will leave King Street, Maidstone at 16:03, reaching East Street/Hunton Hill at 16:22 and then continuing along East Street to Pattenden Lane for set downs only.

## Local Athletes Top Medals Table

It was a record haul of medals for Hunton's athletes at the mini-olympics at the village club on 13<sup>th</sup> August. There were some outstanding performances in a range of very inventive sports that included Sock Put, Rubber Band Archery, and Human Hungry Hippos (an event certain to be making its international debut at the Tokyo games in 2020), with a number of competitors winning multiple medals. There was a sticky moment when Team USA's Stanley, having been offered the inducement of a Kit Kat by Team Australia to compete for them in the Bum-Sled Sprint, in addition to competing for his own country, faced the very real possibility of having to race against himself in the final. Fortunately some swift diplomacy averted the potential crisis. Team Australia were controversially declared the ultimate winners despite a robust appeal from Team China in second place. "I did appeal but they laughed me out of the stadium", said Anna, Team China's spokesperson. "We were robbed of our title I tell you!" ### Finances in the Diocese of Rochester

You may have heard that there are some difficulties in the finances in the diocese. This is true, and is of some concern. The situation is that because of a historical lack of full understanding about the actual financial position - caused by complexity in the way accounts were reported, multiple funds, and one off events which distorted the true picture - the reserves of the diocese have been steadily diminishing. This has been exacerbated by a poor response from parishes under the new pledge scheme and this means that there is a forecasted shortfall for this year which cannot be met through existing reserves.

Clearly, action needs to be taken and the new chair of the Diocesan Board of Finance is working with Bishop's Council to address the challenge. There are short-term actions to keep costs down, and longer term plans to bring the finances back on an even keel. Whilst this is of some concern, there is no need for despair or panic, and I am confident that the issues will be addressed. Please feel free to speak to me if you wish to find out more. Meanwhile, I want to take the opportunity to acknowledge the continued contribution made by our parishes and so many individuals to the wider mission and ministry of the church, both financially and through time and talents offered.
